Publication of Annals

Since the beginning of Year 2013, the Annals of the National Academy of Medical Sciences (India) is being published from the NAMS Centre for Research in Medical Education at AIIMS, Jodhpur under the Editorial Team of Dr. Sanjeev Misra as Editor and Dr. Kuldeep Singh as Associate Editor with the assistance of an Editorial Team and Publication Staff at the NAMS, New Delhi. This arrangement is continued upto printing of the last Issue of ANAMS, i.e. Volume 54, Issue No. 4 for the Year 2018.

To promote the wider dissemination and inclusion of Annals in PUBMED Central and other world indexing agencies, the Publication Committee of the NAMS decided to outsource the publication of the Journal to a competent internationally known publication house. With deliberations and meetings with several publication agencies like Springer, Elsevier, MedKnow, Thieme, etc., members of the Publication Committee recommended to finalize M/s. Thieme Publishing Agency who has agreed to take-up the responsibility of printing the Annals on terms and conditions laid by the NAMS. M/s. Thieme also agreed to facilitate the indexing of the Annals with the reputed Indexing Agencies like MEDLINE/Index Medicus, PMC, EMBASE/Excerpta Medica, SCOPUS, Science Citation Index, Expanded Web of Science, ScienceDirect, etc. Subsequently, this decision, in principle was endorsed by the NAMS Council.

It was decided to enter into a Formal Agreement between the National Academy of Medical Sciences (India) and M/s. Thieme Publishing Agency initially for a period of **five years** to have the Annals printed and promoted with publication of the 1st Issue of 2019, i.e. **Volume 55, Issue No. 1** to last Issue of 2023, i.e. **Volume 59, Issue No. 4**.

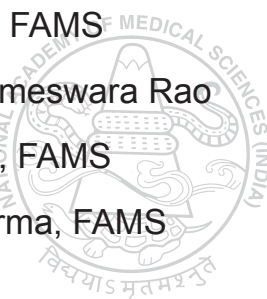
With the publication undertaken by M/s. Thieme, the Cover Page of the Journal and other logistics were changed/modified as per the prevailing international standards.

Annexure II

Text of the Address by the Chief Guest Dr. R P Singh, Secretary General, Quality Council of India, delivered at the 58th Annual Convocation on 27th October 2018 at Puducherry

I am thankful for inviting me for this convocation. I congratulate Dr. Joshi, the President and the President-elect for organizing this NAMS Convocation in Puducherry for the first time and giving us the opportunity to see this wonderful university with so many programs and specialities in Healthcare.

I had been thinking about the discussions we had in Dean's Chamber prior to coming here on how to connect profession to academics. I was a student of Banaras Hindu University, even our President-elect is from the same university and we come from a university which was started by Pt. Madam Mohan Malviya ji. We have seen how an idea like a small seed can germinate into something which the world now recognizes with awe and respect.

We all should make sure that researchers and PhD students inculcate the habit of writing as Dr. Joshi said and we all who have been honored here must commit to contribute to research in India and mentor the next generation. Though many in India still want to do research, the ecosystem of research is not very strong in India. Medical professionals doing research should be promoted because Indian Healthcare requirement in a tropical environment is in many cases very different than the rest of the world. As the Secretary General of Quality Council of India, I would also want to leverage the potential of this august house as well as the organization NAMS to improve healthcare services delivery and make the medical services available at an affordable cost to all, without any discrimination.

Recently, we were assigned a task of verifying in a small care organization, which was paneled under government schemes. The client wanted us to audit that place and to verify whether the cost of care charged by the hospital was legitimate or overcharging was happening. A panel of three doctors were sent to audit which made me realize that at some level

academics have to learn the art of costing and understand the ground realities of the Healthcare Industry. Only then can we think of finding a solution to many ailments which we see in the sector.

Only 70% of health care organizations in the public sector have taken an assurance of quality and gone through the rigorous process of accreditation. This has happened primarily because of not able to comply with the norms of manpower in terms of support for care. When we went around many nursing colleges for G to G negotiations for market access to nursing professionals across the boundaries, we could get only one quality Nursing Institute which was worth the salt of quality. We are unable to create the human resources and are still at the deficient level of 627 doctors / 1 lakh population. But yet in last 20 years, no other country has changed the many indices in healthcare so strongly that India has! This shows that we are doing something clearly right and this need to be protected and promoted in the future. We should always honour the best, but at the same time we need to check on the affordability of medical education as well. Private setup is necessary for India, and I am happy that there are some efforts to make Medical Education affordable for the bright and committed.

I need this organization to do a few things with us. We have got engaged in two very important government schemes “AYUSHMAN BHARAT” and the other is that IRDA has asked us to certify more than 20,000 small health care organizations within next one year. It can’t be done unless I have good, ethical and moral people who go to small health care organization and report back on their compliance to the certification standards. I don’t want good inspectors but want good mentors who can identify a good hospital and hospitals that can be improved over a period of time. In “AYUSHMAN BHARAT”, if your hospital is certified for pre-entry level, it is eligible to get 10% more than the package rates assigned by the government. On full accreditation it can get 15% more than the package rate decided by the government for different procedures. This is good enough incentive for the hospitals to come forward for NABH accreditation.

The other most important thing is to build in capacity to promote quality by conducting CMEs and we at NABH continuously strive to connect

with like-minded organizations to conduct awareness programmes and POIs. Whatever experience or knowledge we have gained should be transferred to the next generation through such national initiatives.

I would be grateful, if the panel comes up with a plan on improving the quality of the health services in India, and Dr. Saroj Chooramani Gopal will be able to discuss it further with us and take it forward. In next one or two years we can show what we did here, stands out in the history of this organization and our collaboration would be a shining example for improving the healthcare in the country

During the year 2018-2019 one meeting of the CME Programme Committee was held on 14th April, 2019.

The Committee, time to time, co-opts Fellows to attend the meeting, depending on the expert advice required, based on the topics of discussion and the received CME proposal.

Extra-mural CME Programmes: These CME Programmes are run under the aegis of CME Programme Committee of the Academy. To improve the quality and contents of the Extramural CME Programmes funded by the NAMS, proposals received for funding are technically reviewed in the first instance by a subject expert who is also a Fellow of the NAMS. This practice has been followed since July 2004, and the reviewers, so designated would evaluate the proposal and identify lacunae, if any, in the programme contents. The reviewers may suggest revision/ modification to be incorporated in the programme. The suggested revision/modifications are communicated to the Organizers and nearly all such suggestions are invariably accepted by the organizers, and only after the CME Scientific Programmes are revised, the CME proposals are processed for the grant-in-aid. A Fellow of the Academy is designated as NAMS Observer to attend and evaluate the Extra-mural CME Programme. The Academy provides TA/DA and Honorarium to Fellows who are nominated as Observers to attend, review and submit report on the CME Programmes.

Out of the CME proposals received from various medical institutions/ professional bodies in the country, the Academy has sanctioned partial financial assistance for organizing Four Extramural CME Programmes during the financial year April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019, the details of which are placed in Annexure IV.

The total expenditure sanctioned on Extramural CME Programmes during April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019 is Rs.4,48,000/-(Rs. Four lakhs forty eight thousand) only.

Intramural CME Programmes: These CME Programmes are run under the aegis of Academic Committee of the NAMS. The Academic Committee identifies, from time to time, topics of national and academic relevance for funding as Intramural CME Programmes. Just like for the Extramural CMEs, the Academy provides TA/DA and Honorarium to Fellows who attend and submit evaluation report on the CME Programmes as NAMS Observers.

The Academy has funded two Intramural CMEs/Symposia during the year 2018-19.

Details of the Intra-mural CMEs are:-

1. CME Programme on **“The Rise of Non-Communicable Diseases in Present Day India”** held at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Puducherry held on 26th October, 2018.
2. NFI-NAMS Symposium on **“India’s Tryst with SDG Nutrition Targets”** held at Kamla Raheja Auditorium & Prof. JS Bajaj Centre for Multi-professional Education, New Delhi held on 27th November, 2018.

The total expenditure in organizing the Intramural CME/Symposia programme was Rs.2,20,000/- (Rupees Two lakhs twenty thousand) only (Annexure IV).

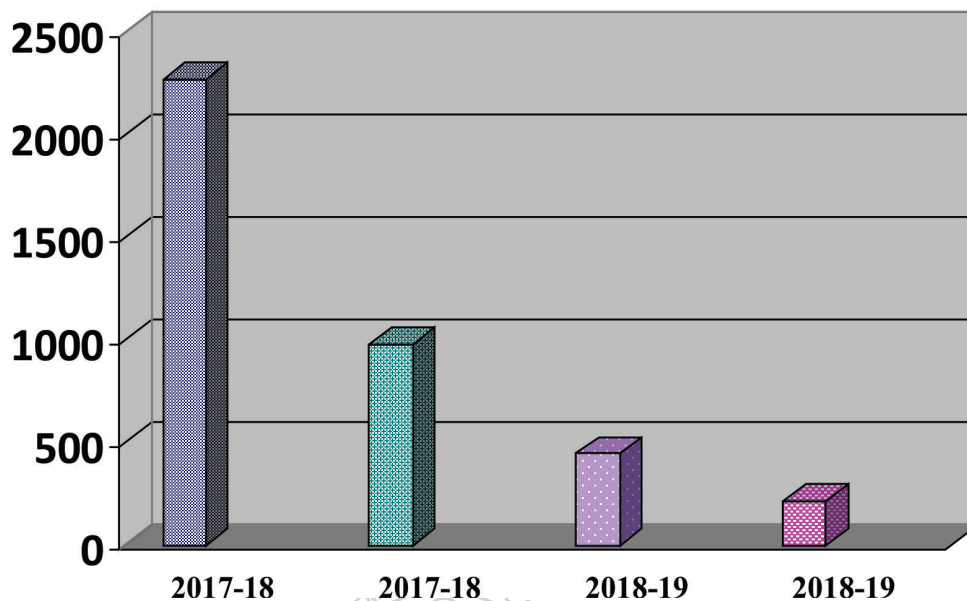


Fig 1. Comparative representation of expenses incurred on Extramural and Intramural CME Programmes in 2017-18 and 2018-19.

Speciality-wise distribution of CME Programmes for 2018-19

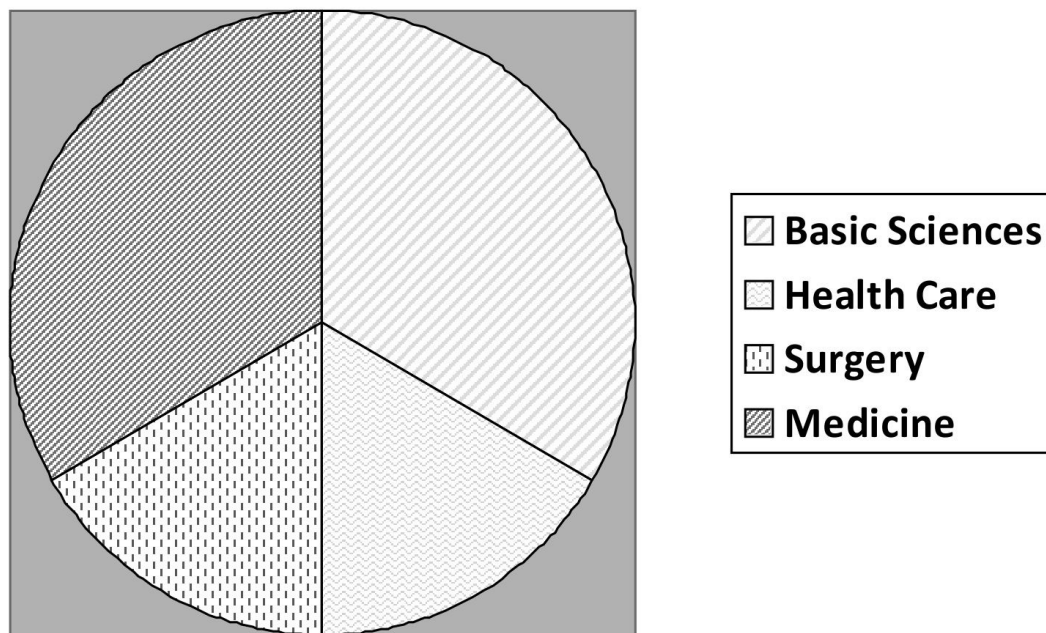


Fig. 3: The Speciality-wise distribution of CME Programmes for 2018-19

1. CME Programme on **“Present Status and Future Challenges of Pharmacovigilance Program of India: Ensuring Safety of Medicine & Medical Devices”** held on October 8, 2018 at Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission, Ghaziabad – 201002.

Main Objectives of the CME Programme

The Objectives of the CME were to:

1. Recognize the need for international drug safety surveillance and understand the regulatory requirement.
2. Understand the basic definitions of terms, scope of work and purpose of Pharmacovigilance used in day-to-day medical practice.
3. Understand the role of the physicians and pharmacists in Adverse Drug Reaction reporting and Pharmacovigilance System.
4. Understand the basic concepts in Pharmacovigilance and hands-on experience to enhance Pharmacovigilance skills of health professionals to promote patient safety.
5. Demonstrate an awareness of risk management and optimal risk minimization methods during drug therapy.
6. Gain solid knowledge and a clear understanding of international approaches to drug safety and Pharmacovigilance, as well as the best practices for successful local and global regulatory applications.

Highlights of the Observer's (Dr. K.K.Sharma, FAMS) Report

In all fifty (50) participants were registered. The Scientific Programme consisted of 8 didactic lectures /deliberations by the expert faculty, including, Dr.G.N.Singh, the Former Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) followed by two Panel discussions/solving of Case Studies Sessions. All through the Scientific Sessions, almost all participants remained present and took part actively as evidenced by questions asked and clarification sought. The ambience of the Scientific Programme was very much academic and encouraging to participants. At the end, all participants were acquainted with activities undertaken by the National Pharmacovigilance Centre at the Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission and as to how they remain connected to the WHO Global Pharmacovigilance Centre: Uppsala (Drug Safety) Monitoring Center (UMC), Sweden for the global exchange Pharmacovigilance and Drug Safety data.

2. CME Programme on **“Development of Teaching Modules for Prescribing Skills Training of Medical Undergraduate Students”** held on 23rd November, 2018 at Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Patna.

Main Objectives of the CME Programme

The Objectives of the CME were to:

1. Revisit the place of prescribing in medical practice.
2. Understand the need and relevance prescribing safely and professionally.
3. Acknowledge prescribing as a skill that can be trained and learned.
4. Familiarize with the critical steps involved in the act of prescribing.

5. Plan the skills training sessions for undergraduate medical students.
6. Conduct the sessions effectively and evaluate the learning.
7. Develop training modules locally.

Highlights of the Observer's (Dr. K.K. Sharma, FAMS) Report

The present Symposium-cum-Workshop was organized with a view to expose the teaching faculty and PG Students in Pharmacology to the new UG Pharmacology Curriculum as envisaged by the MCI and prepare teachers to bring changes in the way the UG students will be taught Pharmacology to become a competent prescriber as per the diagnosis and the identified diseases/health disorders and understand the other essentials required by the doctor to be an efficient prescriber and evaluator of his/her Pharmacotherapy given to the patient.

About 10 Faculty Members took part in carrying out the Symposium activity. There were 5 interactive didactic lectures of 30 min each on different topics related to the theme embedded in between the 3 Workshop Sessions of (i) Evaluation of Training Sessions, (ii) Discussion on Case-based Studies/Learning Exercises and (iii) Group activity followed by presentations of individual Group Activity- Problem-based Learning Modules. Participants were enthusiastic as the theme of the Workshop was challenging and required a lot of imagination and vision to bring a change in the teaching-learning activities of UG medical (MBBS) students which entails both the horizontal and vertical integration of teaching modules to be used in future; besides, how it is going to be implemented and difficulties/challenges it posed for the teachers.

The overall ambience was very academic and assisted by the State-of-the-art multi-media projection and interaction facilities.

3. CME Programme on **“Brachytherapy with Special Emphasis on Gynae Brachytherapy Procedures”** held on 8-9th December, 2018 at SMS Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur.

Main Objectives of the CME Programme

Brachytherapy is a form of radiation therapy in which the radioactive source irradiates the tumor from inside and gives localized dose and high gradient dose fall off. Despite having many advantages, brachytherapy has not been employed to its full potential may be because the following reasons which are narrated as objectives of the present CME:

The Objectives of the CME were to:

1. There is no golden rule about the cases where brachytherapy is to be used and it is totally at the oncologist's discretion, hence proper knowledge and skill development is highly important.
2. It requires good operative skills for applicator placement.
3. Brachytherapy experts are not present at all centres.
4. Brachytherapy requires innovation in terms of applicator construction and use which comes with proper training and experience only and hence not commonly practiced.

Highlights of the Observer's (Dr. Ashok Kumar Sharma, FAMS) Report

The workshop was well attended. Active interactions and discussions were there. The results of the pre- and post- workshop questionnaire shows a minimum of 15-20% improvement.

The CME deliberations brought clarity about the rationale of brachytherapy in gynec cancers providing practical knowledge and to develop & improve skills.

The workshop provided all the information of basic and advanced brachytherapy procedures in Gynec cancer, boosting the morale of the participants and giving confidence to start performing the advanced techniques.

4. CME Programme on **“National Symposium/Workshop on Translational Medicine & Emerging Therapies”** held on 21st & 22nd February, 2019 in the Department of Pharmacology, Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan, West Bengal.

Main Objectives of the CME Programme

The Objectives of the CME were to:

1. Can enumerate steps involved in developing research proposal (knowledge).
2. Enumerate Boolean operators & MESH full form (knowledge).
3. Enumerate types of clinical research (knowledge).
4. Enumerate and discuss methods of sampling and randomization (knowledge).
5. Enumerate the necessary components of informed consent document (knowledge).
6. Able to develop informed consent document (skill).
7. Develop a model Clinical research protocol (skill).

Highlights of the Observer's (Dr. K.K. Sharma, FAMS) Report

CME Programme consisted of two days Academic activity –

- Day 1 (21 Feb., 2019): Workshop on Clinical Research of 9 hours duration
- Day 2 (22 Feb. 2019): Symposium on Translational Medicine and Emerging Therapies – of 9.5 hours duration

- (i) Twenty five participants were registered for the Workshop on Clinical Research on day 1/ (21/02/2019). The participants were varied four PG students to Asstt. Prof./Assoc. Professor level faculty members. Almost all remained present all through the sessions. Workshop Programme consisted of 9.5 hours of sessions, each session started with a lecture background followed by group activity. All participants were very enthusiastic and keenly took part in discussion and group /hands-on activities.
- (ii) More than 100 participants (including the one registered for the Workshop) were registered for the Symposium on “Translational Medicine and Emerging Therapies” on day 2 (22.02.2019). The Symposium was organized in the form of didactic lectures followed by all interactive Q & A sessions in each. All the topics were related to priority areas as envisaged in the National Health Policy 2017, where therapeutic modalities and future directions were discussed for the treatment of Dyslipidaemia, Hypertension, COPD, Cancer, Thyroid disorders, Migraine, TB & HIV co-infection, Bone health, Personalized medicine, Stem-cell therapeutics, Sports Pharmacology and Innovation in Digital Health. All sessions were interactive and both the faculty and the audience were serious about the training-learning activities. The overall ambience was very much academic which encouraged the free discussion and feedback.

Report of Academic Committee & Academic Council

The Meeting of Academic Committee and Academic Council were held on 15th June, 2019. The Members were apprised that two Intramural CMEs held at Puducherry and Delhi; and two CME Programmes under the purview of **“NAMS Intra-mural CME for Skill Development & Medical Education held at NAMS Auditorium** during FY 2018-19, were held at Smt. Kamla Raheja Auditorium and Prof. J.S. Bajaj Centre for Multiprofessional Education. All the programmes were successful and appreciated by the participants.

The recommendations of the meeting are as following:

- **Election of Chairman and Secretary of the Academic Committee**

The Committee elected Dr. Prema Ramachandran as Chairperson and Dr. Deep Narayan Srivastava as Secretary of the Committee.

Dr. Prema Ramachandran stated that it is felt by Dr Gopalan that the collaborative NAMS-NFI conducted Symposia benefit both the institutions and therefore desired that NAMS-NFI Symposia may be continued as a regular activity.

Dr. S.S. Deshmukh presented a copy of her book on “In Search of a Good Doctor” conceptualized & compiled by her, to the President, NAMS with the request that it may be kept in the NAMS library.

The Academic Committee then discussed the idea of a book on Dr Bajaj with articles written by persons who worked with him over a period of time.

- Efforts should be made to hold CME Programme in Himachal Pradesh State. It was also proposed that a meeting with the NAMS Convenors may be organized as early as possible.

- NAMS may start helping NE Region to hold CME programmes and build up network in the medical colleges. If such activities progress well in this year, NAMSCON-2020 can be conducted in Shillong. Dr. Prema Ramachandran felt that they may require assistance in writing the CME proposals and conducting CMEs. Dr. Kameswaran had in the past helped the NEIGRIHMS both in preparing the CME Proposal and in organizing the meeting; he stated that he will be happy to take-up this responsibility this year also.
- **NAMS Intra-mural CME for Skill Development & Medical Education at Smt. Kamla Raheja Auditorium and Prof. J.S. Bajaj Centre for Multiprofessional Education**

The Members were apprised that two (2) CME Programmes under the purview of Skill Development during FY 2018-19, were held at Smt. Kamla Raheja Auditorium and Prof. J.S. Bajaj Centre for Multiprofessional Education. Both the programmes were appreciated by the participants.

Dr. S.S. Deshmukh suggested that NAMS may explore the possibility for organizing CME programmes in association/collaboration with professional associations such as Indian Association of Paediatrics and Public Health, etc.

The members discussed in detail the proposal to explore ways of imparting knowledge to school teachers, parents and paramedical staff in early detection of child problems. The NAMS is already conducting Intra-mural CME Programme, Extramural CME Programme and Skill Development Programmes. It was recommended that a new set of activities may be initiated under the head **“Health Initiatives for people with Special Needs”**. Under this head atleast one programme each will be held in Mumbai, Chennai and Delhi. It was suggested that one Nodal officer may be identified from MHRD and Health Ministry and try to explore how these programmes can be developed in association with the Ministry. Dr. Deshmukh stated that she will be Organizing a programme in end of September, 2019 and will inform the Academy; Dr. Mohan Kameswaran stated that he will try to organize tele-linkages in

Chennai for this programme. NAMS will try to get telelinkages in Delhi. Dr. Kameswaran will also explore the topic for programme in Chennai.

- After detailed discussion a topic approved for CME in NAMSCON-2019 was “**Antimicrobial Resistance**” and the topic for Scientific Symposium was “**Molecular Biology: Impact on Medicine**”. The Symposium will be for 2-hour duration with four speakers to discuss the following topics :

1. An Overview of Present Day Molecular Biology
2. Role of Diagnostics
3. Role of Molecular Biology in Interventional Therapeutics
4. Future Perspectives

The Academic Committee authorized

- Dr. P.K. Dave was requested to receive the Lifetime Achievement Award at AIIMS, Bhopal as he could not receive the same at Puducherry. The Committee after discussion decided to bestow the Lifetime Achievement Award (2019) on Dr. Mukund S. Joshi as proposed by Dr. S.S. Deshmukh and seconded by Dr. P.K. Dave. This was unanimously approved by the Committee.
- The Chairperson stated that Dr. S Padmavati the renowned cardiologist, who received the NAMS Lifetime Achievement Award earlier, will be celebrating her centenary birthday on June 20, 2019. It was decided that the NAMS may consider sending a suitably worded letter appreciating her contribution to the Academy and wishing her a healthy and prosperous life.
- The Secretary brought to the notice of the Committee that for the last 3 years we have not planned/organized any CME Programme under NAMS-PGIMER Symposium. It was recommended that a letter may be sent to the Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh informing him about the MoU signed between NAMS-PGIMER under which a CME is held every year at PGIMER and seeking his views on the CME for the year. In case a positive reply is received from

PGIMER, Chandigarh showing their interest in having association with NAMS, this academic activity may be continued. If they are not interested in continuing such CME activities it may be discontinued.

- The NAMS may explore whether some other organization like NEIGRIHMS, Shillong would like to organize and whether it can coordinate such a Symposium on topics of regional interest every year in different N-E States. A symposium with the collaboration of NAMS.
- The Secretary informed that since January 2019, the publication of Annals of NAMS have been outsourced and a MoU has been signed between NAMS and Thieme. He briefed the members about the process gone through, the terms and conditions of the MOU and the cost. Since, the publication is being undertaken by Thieme the cover page and other logistics has to be changed/modified as per the MoU/guidelines and international standards. Secretary informed that from now on, the articles will be submitted online. For submitting article online a specific format has to be followed. First, the article will be reviewed by the Thieme and then it will be sent to the NAMS reviewer for review. There is a software facility to check for plagiarism. If substantial plagiarism is noted, the article will be rejected. Publishing Annals through Thieme, may shorten the time interval for getting the Annals indexed. NAMS Jodhpur center will continue to dispatch the Annals from Jodhpur. It was proposed to have ethical academic advertisements (mainly about books, periodicals, etc and not about drugs, equipments, etc) in the Annals. The members appreciated these efforts and felt that these changes may bring about improvement in the publication good number of quality articles and hasten national and international recognition for the Annals.
- Secretary stated that usually Editorial Board is constituted for 3 three years. For International indexing atleast one or two international editors have to be there for the Journal Dr.M.S. Boparai is there as the international Editor. Dr Prema stated that she would write to Dr.Soumya Swaminathan and ascertain whether she will be willing to accept the responsibility of being an International Editor. If Dr. Swaminathan regrets, NAMS may explore among Fellows of NAMS

who are settled abroad for becoming the International Editor.

- Secretary stated that M/s Thieme will publish the first Issue of 2019 shortly; the second and the third Issues will be released in NAMSCON 2019 at AIIMS, Bhopal. M/s Thieme has proposed to put their stall at AIIMS, Bhopal. The expenditure incurred on the stalls will be borne by them.
- Secretary proposed that Dr. Harsh Vardhan may be invited to NAMS for the release of newly published 2019 issues of the NAMS Annals. In case he is unable to find time, Annals may be released at NAMSCON 2019 by the President, AIIMS Bhopal. The proposal was unanimously approved. Secretary was requested to take the necessary steps in this direction.



The Medical Scientists' Exchange Programme (Health Manpower Development)

One of the activities promoted by the Academy under Continuing Medical Education Programme in the area of Health Manpower Development is the Exchange of Medical Scientists' possessing positions at junior and middle levels.

The Academy provides funding to junior and middle level specialists/scientists to go to well established centers of excellence and acquire new/ newer skills. Under the scheme, the selected nominees are eligible for reimbursement of traveling expenses (limited to actual II class AC two-tier rail fare) and D.A. @ Rs.300/- per diem during the training period subject to maximum of Rs.5,000/-.

Two hundred two (202) Medical Scientists/Teachers have been selected for the advance training upto the year 2018-19 and have successfully completed their proposed training programmes after getting the grant-in-aid from the NAMS.

Main Objectives of the Symposium:

The Objectives of the Symposium were :

2. To improve the level of quality of health care for NCD.

Organizing Officer: Dr. Prema Ramachandran, Director, Nutrition Foundation of India, New Delhi.

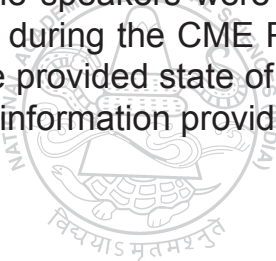
The Objectives of the CME was to familiarize the participants with :

NAMS Intra-mural CME for Skill Development & Medical Education

The CMEs held under the purview of **NAMS Intra-mural CME for Skill Development & Medical Education** held at **NAMS Auditorium** previously named as **Pilot Projects** were held successfully.

Report on NAMS Intra-mural CME for Skill Development & Medical Education held during the period 1st April, 2018 to 31st March, 2019

1. CME Programme on **“Interventional Radiology CME and Workshop on Musculoskeletal Interventions: Educational & Skill Development Course”** held on 20th May, 2018 at Kamla Raheja Auditorium and Prof JS Bajaj Centre for Multi-professional Education, New Delhi.

Organizing Officer: Dr. Deep N. Srivastava, Professor, Dept. of Radiodiagnosis All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi.

Justification to Objectives of the CME

Interventional Radiology techniques are minimally invasive interventional radiology life saving procedure. These procedures are now viable alternatives to traditional invasive therapies and can be performed in the outpatient settings and also as a life saving or palliative or as a standard treatment method. Aims to this programme are :

1. To acquaint the participants on recent advances about the interventional radiology (IR) procedures which help postgraduates and practicing radiologists to learn techniques in Musculo-skeletal (MSK) disorders both in diagnostics and therapeutics.
2. To demonstrate and provide hands-on experience by conducting the procedures on cadavers and phantom models and to train participants to learn the IR-MSK techniques.

3. To use NKN/telemedicine facilities for training and sharing knowledge of IR-MSK procedures with radiologists of other hospitals especially AIIMS, Delhi and Jodhpur.

Highlights of Observer's (Dr.K.K. Sharma) Report:

In the introductory session, the CME Programme Convenor, Dr. Deep N. Srivastava introduced the course faculty, the aim & objectives of the workshop and how the CME Scientific Programme will unfold itself in whole-day sessions. He advised participants to be at ease and should feel free to ask questions, seek clarifications as and when required. All the participants were required to submit Pre-CME and Post-CME Evaluation Questionnaires which helped the organizer in not only evaluating the learning impact outcome of the workshop but also the feedback on the conduct of the Workshop Scientific Programme. The whole ambience of the Scientific Sessions was informal and participants-friendly. All deliberation were encouraging, interactive and created a mind-set in the heart of participants to take the full advantage of the workshop in improving their patient care and teaching/learning activities derived by the participations during the CME deliberations. The objectives of the CME were fulfilled to a large extent. The Organizers provided a well-designed CME-cum-Workshop Scientific Programme. During the deliberation on each topic, participants were informed how they are going to be exposed to various procedures and techniques under discussion during the last Session where Demonstration and Hands-on training will be undertaken. Number of participants registered including faculty were 82. Most of them were present throughout the programme. The programme did not consist of only didactic lectures through slide shows but also had demonstrations of a number of instruments, models and multi-media real-time video animations to explain the techniques and procedures under discussion.

Interactive session/Small group learning activities were conducted as hands-on demonstration cum do-your-self group activity by using four workstations to demonstrate various MSK-IR techniques and procedures. All four workstations utilized models of vertebral column, individual vertebra, phantom limbs, trunk, cadaver and mannequins. Participants were divided into four groups of 20 participants each to be accommodated on four workstations in rotation. Eight Faculty members

managed each workstation where hardware and techniques of MSK-IR procedures related to all topics and conditions covered in the earlier three sessions were demonstrated. A variety of instruments, models of vertebral column, individual vertebra, phantom limbs, trunk, and cadaver and mannequins were used to explain and show the IR techniques and procedures. All workstations were attended by the group of participants in rotation. All participants were very enthusiastic as they not only first shown and understood the nitty-gritties of the demonstrated techniques and procedures but also performed the same hands-on by themselves under the supervision of the course faculty. The CME-cum-Workshop basically covered the role of IR in the diagnosis of MSK disorders in four separate but integrated sessions. First session consisted of three lectures which were devoted to the topics as to how imaging technology has improved the outcome of FNAC/Biopsies; Articular and Nonarticular Injections as diagnostic and therapeutic modalities. Session II covered topics on an overview, techniques hardware used and their status in thermal ablation of osteoid osteomas and angio-embolization of MSK tumors. In Session III, there was discussion and demonstration on the techniques used for spinal interventions. In this session IR Procedures for Laser Disc Decompression (IR-PLDD), Facet Joint IR and Vertebral Augmentation IR techniques were not only theoretically covered by the speaks but various procedures were demonstrated by real-time animation technology and slide shows. State-of-the-art AV aids were provided which helped the programme much appreciated by the participants who enjoyed not only the ambience but also the scientific contents of the CME. Yes, all scientific presentations were evidence-based and supported by the real-time multi-media slides and animation videos related to the IR-MSK procedures. The information provided was evidence-based.

2. Discussion Meeting on **“Unmet Needs in Health Care of India”** held on 30th March, 2019 at Kamla Raheja Auditorium and Prof. JS Bajaj Centre for Multi-professional Education, New Delhi.

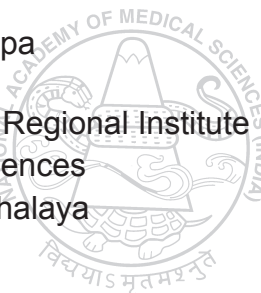

Emeritus Professors of NAMS

Summary on Report/Lectures Delivered by Emeritus Professors of NAMS 2018-19

1. Summary of Lectures delivered by Dr. T.D. Chugh, Emeritus Professor, NAMS

(i) Optimisation of Diagnostic Microbiology with Clinical Practice at VMMC and Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi on November 13, 2018

We are in the era of Evidence-based medicine and moving to personalized/genomic medicine. Laboratory services play a major role in the management of infection diseases. Laboratory reports should be accurate, adequate, relevant and timely (turn-around-time and point-of-care tests) Quality Control should be Mandatory. Institutional data of laboratory errors based on Internal, National and International quality control must be the basis of Accreditation. Furthermore, we need to develop National Treatment Guidelines based on Indian data and Clinical expertise.

The second part was Interactive discussion of 5 Clinical cases with Clinicians and laboratory physicians and pharmacologists. The session lasted for 2 ½ hours.

(ii) Global Overview of Antimicrobial Resistance at AIIMS, Jodhpur on February 1-2, 2019

Antibiotic consumption rate in 76 countries during the past 16 years (2000-2015) increased by 39% while India showed a rise of 103%, the highest in the world. The mortality rate due to MDR and XDR bacterial infections in India is reported to be 1.57 and 2.65 times higher respectively than sensitive bacterial infections. The clever evolutionary process of microbes, lack of knowledge of epidemiology of infectious diseases, substandard diagnostic facilities and inappropriate/ overuse/misuse of antimicrobials in low and middle (LMIC) has led to the present state of antimicrobial resistance. We need to use novel strategist: Quality microbiology services,

knowledge of Pk, Pd and pharmaco-vigilance, antimicrobial stewardship programme, infection control practices, improved public health measures and sustained effort to make a behavioral change of healthcare personnel, and control of nonhuman use of antibiotics.

2. Summary of Lectures delivered by Dr. J.N. Pande, Emeritus Professor, NAMS

(i) “Burden of Disease Mortality and Risk Factors in India” Continuing Medical Education Program organized by Sitaram Bhartia Institute of Science and Research, New Delhi, on August 23rd, 2018.

Burden of disease in India according to important risk factors is an important study pioneered by Dandonna in collaboration with the international collaborators. Major findings of the study need to be highlighted for the physicians and the general public as well as the policy makers. Most of the risk factors for chronic cardiovascular disease are well known but they cannot be over-emphasized in the Indian context.

Important risk factors for acute myocardial infarction included: Poorly controlled diabetes mellitus, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, lack of physical activity, and smoking in the above order of importance.

Important risk factors for Stroke included poorly controlled diabetes, hypertension, atrial fibrillation, high cholesterol and obesity, in the above order of importance. Needs to Diabetes mellitus, hypertension, obesity, physical inactivity and dyslipidemia are closely inter-related.

Adoption of healthy life-style is a no-cost intervention which needs to be popularized.

(ii) “Diagnosis and Management of Hyponatremia” organized by Sitaram Bhartia Institute of Science and Research, on 29th December, 2018

Sodium (salt) is important for sustenance of life. It has played an important part in in the in the freedom struggle of India pioneered by Mahatma

Gandhi. There is now a global effort to reduce the daily consumption of salt from 6-12 G/day to less than 3G. Being the cheapest food preservative, it is not an easy task. High consumption of salt is associated with increased risk of hypertension, cardiovascular disease and death. Increase in serum sodium from 130 to 140 mmol/L increased the systolic blood pressure by 5.5 mm of Hg (95% confidence interval 2.4-8.6 mm Hg). Corresponding increase in diastolic pressure was smaller (3.1, 95% confidence interval 1.3-5.0 mm Hg). (Pande JN. Annals of National Academy of Sciences) It is therefore paradoxical that a large number of patients, particularly, the elderly, are at a serious risk for life threatening complications.

Hyponatremia, defined as a decrease in serum sodium below 136 mmol/L, is a common occurrence in both inpatients and outpatients and can be found in up to 15% of the general hospital populations. Acute hyponatremia (duration < 48 h) and its management can be a cause of major morbidity and mortality among patients in hospital.

Chronic hyponatremia (duration > 48 h), typically seen among older (≥ 65 yr) outpatients, also contributes to morbidity because it is often unrecognized. Its rapid correction is inadvisable. Pseudohyponatremia: due to marked hyperlipidemia or increase in plasma proteins; directly measured plasma osmolality is normal Isotonic or hypertonic hyponatremia: due to hyperglycemia and unmeasured solutes e.g., mannitol, radiographic contrast, glycine. Use correction factor for hyperglycemia or measure osmolality directly.

Typically, correction of serum sodium concentration in patients with acute hyponatremia should occur at a more rapid rate than in patients with chronic hyponatremia because the symptoms are usually more severe when serum sodium rapidly decreases over a short period. Chronic hyponatremia is slowly compensated in the brain so that this requires slow correction, if at all. Hypovolemic hyponatremia occurs in cases of volume contraction, such as is seen with vomiting and diarrhea, excessive sweating and use of diuretics. A patient may present with frank hypotension or with postural hypotension or tachycardia. In this setting, release of both antidiuretic hormone (ADH) (decreases renal permeability to water) and renin (increases renal sodium retention) occurs. Suspected hypovolemic

hyponatremia may be confirmed by a urine sodium concentration below 20 mmol/L, urine osmolality greater than 500 mOsm/kg H₂O and, typically, low urine volume. However, clinicians should be aware that patients with diuretic use may not have a low urine sodium level despite being hypovolemic. Patients with severe hyponatremia should be referred to a specialist conversant with their diagnosis and management.

**(iii) “Diagnosis and Management of Sarcoidosis” organized by
Sitaram Bhartia Institute of Science and Research, New Delhi,
on 6th Feb, 2019**

Sarcoidosis is a systemic inflammatory disorder of uncertain etiology associated with widespread granulomatous inflammation which may affect almost any organ of the body, with the brunt being borne by the lungs and mediastinal lymph nodes in a majority of patients. Sarcoidosis occurs world-wide with variations according to geographical location, race, gender, socio-economic status and age. Certain forms of sarcoidosis affecting the skin, or certain specific organs may also show geographical variation. Further, the severity of disease and its progression, outcome of treatment, major organ dysfunction and mortality may also vary depending upon race, ethnicity, health seeking behaviour and access to care. The incidence of sarcoidosis has been reported as 11.5 per 100,000 per year, and a prevalence of 0.16%. Northern Europeans and African Americans have generally been considered to have highest prevalence of Sarcoidosis. More recent studies report almost similar incidence of disease amongst females and males whereas many reports in the past suggested female preponderance. Sarcoidosis once considered to be rare in south-east Asia and the middle east is now being increasingly recognized in these regions and other parts of the world. Etiology of sarcoidosis continues to be elusive despite intensive research in the area. Sarcoidosis is a heterogeneous disorder with several different phenotypic presentations, epidemiological features, and variable course of the disease and prognosis. It is generally accepted that this heterogeneity is related to genetic factors, environmental factors, epidemiologic variables including age, gender and race, and their interactions amongst themselves.

It is hypothesized that interplay between genetic factors and environmental, occupational and para-occupational exposures can lead to development

of sarcoidosis. In this regard, several studies have shown that certain metals can cause sarcoid-like granulomatous inflammation, the most classical example being exposure to beryllium, but other environmental pollutants including, titanium, nickel, chromium, cobalt, silicon, earth elements, and aluminum may also have a role. There are several similarities in the clinical presentation of sarcoidosis and tuberculosis which on occasion presents as mediastinal lymphadenopathy. Indeed, the differentiation between tuberculosis and sarcoidosis may be challenging in countries with high burden of tuberculosis.

It is likely that persistent antigen(s) such as mycobacterial or other microbial products in conjunction with certain environmental pollutants acting as adjuvants incite in genetically predisposed subjects an immune response characterized by widespread granulomatous inflammation with variable phenotypic presentations.

In order to attain digitized facilities, NAMS had started Online Payment System through Website & also Online submission of Articles for Annals. NAMS has also started NAMS YouTube Channel (National Academy of Medical Sciences India), which is free for wide circulation of CMEs organized under the aegis of NAMS. With the help of NKN connectivity, NAMS connects to other academic institutions like AIIMS, Jodhpur, Rishikesh, Bhopal, Patna, Bhubaneswar, etc. so that persons from distant places can also participate in interactive sessions and teaching learning programmes. This not only enhances the goals of our GoI but also minimizes the financial expenditures.

The CME Programme on “INDIA’S TRYST WITH SDG NUTRITION TARGETS” was the first Tele-CME for North-East region to transmit the programme to audience of NEIGRIHMS, Shillong. through NKN connectivity held on 27th Nov. 2018. Two national institutions, AIIMS-Jodhpur and NEIGRIHMS, Shillong, Meghalaya, were connected during the programme.
