

Peer-review time:


Manuscripts peer-review time has commendably reduced from 164 in previous years to 99.5 days, showing the efficiency of the Editorial team.



The turnaround time for acceptance to publishing also got significantly reduced from 141 to 83.5 days, the overall effect resulted in a reduction of the publication time from 272 to 129 days! This is a 53% reduction in overall time taken from submission to publication.

Visibility:

Downloads: Compared to 2024, till date in 2025, the journal has 32,77,563 more downloads! Showing an overall 57% growth in terms of downloads and resulting visibility.





The low acceptance rate is commendable, adds significantly to the overall prestige of the journal, and sets a benchmark that ANAMS only accepts top-quality content.



We have started the International Fellowship and Membership for overseas Indians, NRI's and we have 9 International Fellowships and 1 International Membership accepted for this year.

Sir, in 2022, when I was privileged to lead this Council, we, together with the Council, developed NAMS Vision-2030. I will briefly narrate the major activities of the Academy in the last three years.

We prepared policy documents for policy makers, NAMS constituted 28 Task Forces of eminent medical professionals to prepare policy documents to provide support to the Govt. of India for considering inclusion of important points in the policies of the Health. I do hope under Madam Punya, these will continue to be accepted and given attention too. In last three years, we have in 115 institutions, high-quality CMEs, Symposia and workshops. We started a National Virtual CME called Navigate Medico CME in January 2023, to help postgraduate students in the country. As of now, 41 sessions have been completed. We also started with AIIMS, New Delhi, AIIMS-NAMS Navigate Medico CME in September 2023. Thanks to Dr. M. Srinivas, Director AIIMS, for his support. Many teachers who have participated in these CMEs have volunteered their time to become mentors and to hold the hands of students to guide them.

Sir, we launched a leadership development programme called LEAD workshops for the first time for the Directors, Deans, and Heads of the institutions. We have completed 3 leadership programmes and have trained 76 participants from All India Institutes, Medical Colleges, Institute of National importance, and many medical colleges. I also encourage Fellows to join the next Leadership Programme.

Sir, looking at the change in the learning methods, NAMS collaborated with the International Institute of Information Technology, Hyderabad (IIIT-H) and started an online certificate course on 'AI in Health' for

health professionals from September, this year. Thanks to Dr. Abhay Karan, Secretary, DST and Prof. P.J. Narayan, Director, IIIT-H. Now, 142 doctors have converted into AI professionals. Our next course will start in January, 2025 and you can enroll. The mid-term conference at Bombay, organized by Dr. Ashok Gupta, also brought AI into the mainstream of the medical curriculum.

Biostatistics is needed by every MD, DM, MCh student, and with more than 700 medical colleges, there is a paucity of biostatisticians. Sir, with the help of ICMR, a National Biostatistics helpline was started, and I am very happy to say that DG-ICMR, started this helpline.

NAMS also recognizes women in medicine and we have this as an annual event. We do networking a lot and all medical colleges in twice get connected with the National Academy. To engage the youngsters, we have started the National Medical Quiz. NAMS cells have been established in 62 medical colleges of 23 states in the country.

On behalf of the Council Members, Past Presidents, and our President-Elect, I would like to thank you. I am very indebted to the organizing team led by Dr. G.D. Puri, and I do hope NAMS will grow, and your coming here is a big blessing.

Thank you and welcome to this Convocation.

Address of the Chief Guest, Hon'ble Vice President of India Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar, delivered at the 64th Annual Convocation on 23rd November, 2024 at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Jodhpur

Good Evening, all of you,

Dr. Shiv Sarin, President, NAMS, I know him, who is very passionate about his mission, and that is 'Health'. It was my good fortune to have agreed to the request to be at Jodhpur, the Sun city and particularly at AIIMS Jodhpur, for this occasion to interact and share my thoughts with professionals who matter hugely to society and humanity.

The presence of Secretary, Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, Dr. Punya Salila Srivastava, is indicative of the attention the government is paying to this very vital sector.

The presence of Dr. Rajesh Sudhir Gokhale, Secretary, Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, also indicates a big change that has taken place in governance. Dr. G.D. Puri, we are your guests, you are being profusely and rightly thanked for making it absolutely facilitating for all of us.

Dr. Digambar Behera, President-Elect and I am sure he will have next three years very challenging and take this institution and its mission on incremental trajectory and pass on the baton to the next person for being in exponential mode.

Distinguished persons in the audience, fellows, members, associate members and distinguished audience, for me, it is an absolute honour to be associated with the 64th Convocation and NAMSCON 2024 and it has a contemporaneously relevant theme- "One health, let us collaborate to take care of our health".

Friends, when I came here, I had the occasion to go through the list of the distinguished fellows, of this great institution, which includes the distinguished scientist who adorned the high office of President of India, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam and from our own state Rajasthan, Dr. K.C. Gangwal, Dr. S.R. Dharkar, Dr. Gautam Shiv Kumar Sharma and Dr. Sheetal Raj Mehta. For the simple reason, I had the occasion to know them personally and to get benefit out of their counsel.

Distinguished audience, I seek to avail the opportunity to applaud Dr. Siddharth Dev Manav, an alumnus of Saini School, Chittorgarh, my alma mater, who donated his dead body to this institution for study and research. Friends, just a few months back at Jaipur, at an event organised by Jain Social Groups, Central Sansthan Jaipur and Dadithi Deh Daan Samiti, Delhi, I had indicated that organ donation is the highest moral exemplification of human nature and citizens should make conscious efforts towards it. We need to promote organ donation. It gives life to those who lose hope of life and therefore, I thought it fit to recognise what has been done by Dr. Siddharth Dev Manav.

To the newly inducted fellows, you stand amongst India's medical luminaries. This fellowship is based on through meticulous peer review and peer review friends, is the most difficult because it is objective. Consider this not your destination but a milestone in your journey of service to humanity.

Friends, let us look around our Bharat at the moment in a global perspective. There has been an exponential economic upsurge. My generation never dreamt of it, never conceived it, never thought it

was possible. But we are having an exponential economic upsurge and phenomenal infrastructure growth in last few years. This has made Bharat as big five global economies, on way to becoming third largest global economy ahead of Japan and Germany in next year or two. And this has generated an atmosphere of hope and possibility in the country. Our aspirations have taken wings and we have, in togetherness, chalked out a programme that our Bharat will be a developed Bharat at 2047. But friends, this aspirational object, very ambitious, requires an eightfold increase in our per capita income. And this takes me to something that is of your interest. This is attainable only if our population is healthy and fit. One may be committed, sincere, earnest, gifted, devoted, but if that person is not physically healthy, rather than helping society at large, with his dedication and expertise, he would be seeking help. And therefore, it is essential that everyone in the country remains healthy. That is the only password to make our journey fructify into our destination, Bharat, a developed nation at 2047, health is paramount and priority concern, as good health is not only necessary for individuals, not for our pursuits, but for the good health of the society. That, broadly, is also your thing.

Friends, having good health is directly related to your productivity, as I said. If you are not healthy, your productivity will not be optimal. As a matter of fact, it may nose-dive. Rather than helping others, you might be seeking others' help. Humare Rishi Muni keh gaye, aur wo sahi baat keh gaye- "Pehla sukh nirogi kaya". They put health as a priority, in precedence to everything else. Health, well-being is fundamental and quintessential to one's making contribution to society. Health, friends, is not just absence of illness, but a state of holistic well-being. Our Vedas, our Puranas, our Upanishads, are a mine store, gold mine of wisdom and knowledge. We need to base to attention on them. It emanates from them. I quote-"Prassan, Indriye, man, atman, the harmony between mind, body and spirit, that is essential for a person to perform and be a complete human being".

It was the foresight of India's Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, that he could secure in the shortest time, the largest support of nations, or yoga, when he addressed the United Nations General Assembly. We now have International Yoga Day that is celebrated in every nook and corner of the globe. Yoga is not just for that event, it has to be way of life with us.

Friends, medical professionals serve as guardians. And their role is all the more significant in Bharat, that is home to one sixth of humanity. Your concern must be beyond clinical care. You have to be engage in advocacy of good health. You have to become educators and public health advocates.

But the challenges are there now in healthcare. And the challenges are commercialisation and ethical dilution, which need to be addressed. Healthcare is a divine contribution. Healthcare is service. Healthcare has to be far distant from commerce. And healthcare is antithetical to exploitation.

By and large, our system is in good health. But we can't say as on this date that instances of commercialisation and ethical dilutions are not there. That bodies like this, you all are code of conduct and exemplify by action that any transgression on these twins would attract the wrath of the regulator.

NAMS serves a great purpose. It deserves commendation for its vital contribution to India's healthcare planning. Their evidence-based guidance has significantly shaped national health policies, medical education reforms, and public health strategies. We all know in a country like ours, policy planning is a very tough job. We need to have credible data. We need to have thought process. We need to get into a situation where experts apply their minds. This body has done something amazingly commendable. The input has come to me from several quarters. Congratulations to this body.

Friends, strategic reforms and digital innovation have transformed India's healthcare landscape. But I would say, there has been a paradigm shift now. We are witnessing another industrial revolution. Disruptive technologies have made in roads in every walk of life. Artificial intelligence, data analytics, machine learning, blockchain chain and the kind. These have to find increasing employability in the system. And that can be done only when institutions like this are in overdrive mode. I was so happy to

notice when the president was indicating how they are having convergence of thought processes of leading institutions that is required. We must never forget there was a time in ancient Bharat, when we had institutions of eminence- Nalanda, Takshila. People from all over the globe came to this country in search of knowledge, wisdom. In the process, we also gained, they also gained. Time has come and India is on the rise. The rise is unstoppable. We must ensure our institutions get into that eminence category at a global level. And that requires a change of mindset which actually has taken place by and large. There was a time we thought anything coming from the West, we need not examine, we had to follow. That is no longer in vogue.

Friends, big changes have taken place in this country. A country at the moment of 1.4 billion people; Ayushman Bharat, PMJAY, Arogya Yojana, they provide coverage to virtually everyone up to 5 lakhs, 104 million families. India is a nation that in recent times has attained what to others is astronomical. Like 500 million Indians were included in the banking sector world's largest exercise. Just imagine cooking gas was made available to needy women to the extent of 150 or 170 million free. So ours is a country where we have to have an ecosystem that has to operate at a gigantic level. And that has been done. Our Arogya Mandirs are geometrically increasing. We are having more AIIMS, medical colleges, number of seats for medical education, paramedical courses. One offshoot of Ayushman Bharat is that there has been much-needed required growth paramedical services that has taken place. In this situation, India's healthcare provides science through its remarkable achievements. We happen to be the only country in the world that COVID vaccine was given to 130 billion citizens. With indigenous COVID vaccines, earning reputation as world's pharmacy. We help other nations also. And what is more striking friends, a matter of joy for all of us. A certificate that a person has been vaccinated was never given on paper. It was digital. It was instant. A feat not achieved even by the most developed nation. Now we are known as pharmacy of the world.

But time has come for a different shift now. We must engage and strongly champion, locally manufactured medical equipment. Let us demolish the myth that imported items are superior. Not any longer. Through this platform, I will urge Indian industry, business, trade and commerce to engage into activities of making medical equipment in the country; for the nation; also for the world. But that will require again, some kind of hand-holding by people in the front row here, by people on the dais, your institutions.

Another aspect, go to any part of the world, the kind of quality medical assistance India gives for value is not available elsewhere. This has made India an attractive destination for people to come here for treatment. This has taken a new shape also- "Medical tourism". Only if I give you figures, this year, 7.3 million medical tourists came to this country. It was preferred destination, Why? Because we have competent human resources, we have supporting infrastructure, we have world class hospitals-in public sector, In private sector. But we must have more of it. As India confidently marches towards Viksit Bharat, a marathon march, We all are foot soldiers. For that it is required that there must be robust public private partnership to take our health infrastructure, equipment and otherwise to the highest global benchmark.

Friends, I strongly advocate and urge, India must pioneer the healthcare technology revolution, embracing as I said, Artificial intelligence, Genomics and biotechnology. With modern tools, I indicated, we have engaged into AI diagnostics, telemedicine and robotic surgery, becoming essential and backed by strong government support, our medical sector is poised for unprecedented transformation. I had the good occasion to be present at a hospital in Jaipur, where an operation was done by a young surgeon using robotics and the event was watched globally, more particularly in developed countries.

Friends, our focus should be- Prevention, Precaution and, Eradication. It was so soothing to note that the health minister declared yesterday, 2025 tak TB ka unmulon complete ho jaega. And this country has achieved phenomenally regarding some of the diseases. So I strongly advocate and plead with the healthcare experts to be champion for preventive wellness and health education.

Now there is another aspect, our traditional medicines are known for efficacy. Well, let us adopt it. After all, this country has seen midwives in every village doing a remarkably good job and therefore, when we have such a rich background, let us monetise it. The wisdom embedded in these traditional systems is profound and now this is all over the country. People from all over the globe are drooping to this country. To what we say our health resorts, to get yoga treatment. If they don't have an ailment and they wish to get fitter, they go for a course. That being so, let us make this also an important fundamental premise of the Indian health care system. It must be integrated because it emanates from our heritage. This requires both research and a fundamental shift in perspective. Moving beyond the fast dichotomy, that equates ancient with backward and western with progress, It still does on some occasions. I have felt it, though it is fast receding. But now we have to make the reverse of it.

Friends, your dedication to healthcare excellence will not only shape India's future, it will also contribute to the welfare of humanity at large because "Vasudhaiv Kutumbakam" -We take the world to be one family. One planet, one family, one future, that has been our message to the world.

Once again, my congratulations to all the fellows and members of the National Academy of Medical Sciences. With the permission of the President, I'm inviting members of the Council and fellows also, to be my guests at the new building of the Indian Parliament. You will love to see what a marvel has been created by we have of the new building of Parliament. So I'm sure my invite will be accepted, and soon I'll be having a visit by your fellows and faculty.

Friends, distinguished audience, may your pursuit of excellence continue to illuminate the path towards a healthier, more prosperous India. Let us take care of the health of the nation and of the planet.

ICMR-NAMS National Biostatistics Helpline for PG Medical Students

Both ICMR & NAMS recognize the critical role of Epidemiologists and Biostatisticians in medical research, especially for postgraduate students undertaking thesis projects. To support these students in designing and analyzing their research work, ICMR & NAMS have come together to establish a Joint "ICMR-NAMS National Biostatistics Helpline" by having a dedicated website with an on-line facility, supported by highly qualified biostatisticians and epidemiologists to help medical post-graduates and young faculty members across the country to facilitate and resolve their queries related to research work.

1. Nature of Entity

The **National Academy of Medical Sciences** is a society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, engaged in health-related awareness, medical education, professional development, community health camps, and outreach programmes. It operates as a Not-for-Profit Organisation (NPO).

2. Fixed Deposits and Interest Accrued

The Association has made term deposits with nationalised/scheduled banks. As per accrual basis, interest accrued but not received on these FDRs as on 31st March 2025 is ₹_71,02,432/- 0 (PY 68,10,050/-) and has been recognised as income for the year. FDR wise detail of interest accrued not made. This balance is subject to reconciliation, and confirmation.

3. Grant Utilisation

Grants received during the year $\P_3,00,000,000$, (PY 2,28,00,000) are shown as income. The amount of $\P_1,20,979$ (PY 60,053) remains **unutilised** and is refunded and shown as expense during the year under consideration.

4. Life Subscription Corpus Donations

During the year Life Subscription Corpus of Rs.92,65,825 (P.Y.(85,30,998/-) received. Out of which 75% life subscription corpus amounting to Rs.69,49,369/-(P.Y.63,98,248/-) has been transferred to the Life subscription Corpus Fund during the year under consideration as per the bye-laws of the academy. There are no contributions from foreign sources under FCRA during the year.

5. Related Party Transactions

No related party transactions were conducted during the year other than reimbursement of actual expenses incurred by office bearers for official work.

6. NBE Reimbursement of expenses:

The Academy has two buildings, known as the old building and the new building Smt. Kamla Raheja Auditorium and J.S.B. Centre for Multi-Professional Education. The Academy and National Board of Examination (NBE) are sharing the accommodation of the old building in accordance with the terms and conditions which has been approved by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India. The Academy is incurring all maintenance expenses, and 50% of those expenses are recovered from NBE as reimbursement of expenses

7. CURRENT ASSETS, LOANS, AND ADVANCES

In the opinion of the Management, the current assets, loans and advances have a value on realization in the ordinary course of business, equal to at least the aggregate amount shown in the Balance Sheet.

8. Tax Exemption

The Association is registered under **Section 12AB** of the Income-tax Act, 1961. There being no taxable income under Income Tax Act 1961, no provision for the Income tax has been considered necessary.

9. Contingent Liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities as on 31st March 2025. (P.Y. 91,60,454/- of Income Tax)

Dr. M. Srinivas, Director, AIIMS, New Delhi, and Dr. Vivek Lal, Director, PGIMER, were the Guests of Honour.

Lt. Gen. Dr. Velu Nair, PVSM, AVSM, VSM** (Retd), President-Elect NAMS, welcomed the dignitaries and the guests. Dr. Digambar Behera, President NAMS, in his address described the historical development of NAMS, its academic achievements, newer initiatives, and future vision of NAMS. Dr. M. Foundation Day Orations of the National Academy of Medical Sciences (India) on 21st April 2025

On the NAMS Foundation Day celebrations, the NAMS Family Members, Eminent National Medical and Biomedical professionals, Presidents of National Professional organisations and National academies are invited.

During the 65th Foundation Day of the National Academy of Medical Sciences (India), organised 21st April 2025 at the National Academy of Medical Sciences Auditorium, NAMS Foundation Day Orations were organised on Breast Cancer and Cancer Cervix for creating awareness among the general public and college students on these important public health issues.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in India, accounting for approximately 25% of all female cancer cases. The age-standardized incidence rate of female breast cancer has increased significantly in recent years. There's a concerning trend of increased incidence in younger Indian women (between the ages of 30 and 40). Dr. S.M Bose, Sr. Consultant, General Surgery, at Fortis Mohali Hospital, former Senior Professor and Head of Surgery from PGI, delivered NAMS Foundation Day oration on the topic of breast cancer.

Cervical cancer is the second most common cancer among women in India, after breast cancer. It is a leading cause of cancer deaths among women in India. India accounts for a significant portion of the global cervical cancer burden. In 2020, India had 123,907 new cases of cervical cancer and 77,348 deaths. Human Papillomavirus (HPV) infection, particularly HPV types 16 and 18, is the primary cause of cervical cancer. Dr. Neerja Bhatla, Padma Shri awardee, for Pioneering Work in Cervical Cancer Prevention, former Head of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at AIIMS Delhi, delivered NAMS Foundation Day oration on the topic of detection, prevention, and management of cervical cancer.

Scrolls distribution for MNAMS & Associate Members

The scroll distribution function was organized for newly elected MNAMS & Associate Members during the 65th Foundation Day of the National Academy of Medical Sciences (India) function, on 21st April 2025.

Dr. Digambar Behera, President NAMS and Lt. Gen. Dr. Velu Nair, PVSM, AVSM, VSM** (Retd.), President-Elect NAMS, distributed scrolls to 30 MNAMS & 10 Associate members during the function.

4. Guest lecture on "A New Way to Manage Asthma and Eczema in Children: Onesizefits1"

The National Academy of Medical Sciences (India), organised the guest lecture on 6th August 2025 by Dr. Somnath Mukhopadhyay, Head of Department of Clinical and Experimental Medicine, Chair of Paediatrics, Brighton and Sussex Medical School, UK.

Dr. Digambar Behera, President NAMS welcomed and introduced to the distinguished speaker Dr. Somnath Mukhopadhyay. Dr. K.K. Talwar, in his opening remarks, highlighted that the research work of Professor Somnath Mukhopadhyay on the role of skin barrier function and other gene variation in allergy-related diseases has led to a change in the management of paediatric asthma and eczema. The lecture focused on his research evidence to establish a new person-centred clinical approach at the Royal Alexandra Children's Hospital (Brighton, UK), changing the provision of care for children under 6 months of age. Researchers at BSMS in partnership with the Royal Alexandra Children's Hospital, are currently exploring the importance of public engagement with research. This work seeks to understand the unique interplay of genetic and environmental factors affecting individual children suffering from allergy, asthma, and eczema.

Dr. Y.K. Gupta moderated the session.

- 9. **Leadership Development (LEAD)**: This important initiative has been launched for Directors, Deans, Heads of Departments, and senior faculty members of AIIMS, medical colleges, and institutions of national importance. The programme aims to empower them to become visionary leaders and effective agents of change.

The 110 students participated and complete the course. A full day of physical interaction of the participants with the IT Professionals was organized at two places in Hyderabad and NAMS, Delhi.

The Guidelines for NAMSCON. Guidelines for Organization and Funding of Annual Conference of National Academy of Medical Sciences (India) (NAMSCON) (Including Mid-Term NAMSCON)

Annual Conference of National Academy of Medical Sciences (India), also known as NAMSCON, is a prestigious function and is a matter of pride for the organizers and the organizing institution. The same applies to the mid-term conferences.

The following guidelines are laid down to facilitate the organization of these conferences and to clarify the roles and responsibilities of the various stakeholders.

Responsibilities of the Organizing Committee (Including the Head of the Host Institution) (Some time there may not be an institution involved, but desirable)

- i. A Fellow of the Academy who wishes to organize an annual or mid-term conference of NAMS, will submit a proposal to this effect to the Academy in a prescribed performa (A performa should be made for submitting the proposal: already made / approved Ann 1). The proposal should include the details of an Organizing Committee (of at least 3 members, Chairman, Org. Secretary and Treasurer), which must be headed by a Fellow of the Academy.
- ii. The organizing committee will make scientific programme in close coordination with NAMS secretariate. Scientific programme normally should consist of Guest lectures, Key-note lectures, parallel, theme-based CME programmes and Workshops on important contemporary medical and health issues during the NAMSCON, for students, faculty members and medical professionals. The conference duration and the number of sessions would generally correspond to the past practice, and be mutually decided by the Organizing Committee and NAMS.
- iii. The Organizing Committee will have the primary responsibility for generation of funds, through various sources including but not limited to registration fees for attending the conference and grants and sponsorships from various agencies.
- iv. The Organizing Committee will sign an MOU (draft enclosed Ann 2), which may includes an undertaking by the Organizing Committee to NAMS that the Committee will generate their own resources and funds for various purposes, including venue, auditorium, lecture theatres, A-V Aids, zoom ink etc. and other support facilities.
- v. The Organizing Committee may seek collaboration with local universities, medical/ dental/ nursing colleges, professional bodies, other organizations in government and private sector for sharing of resources, such as infrastructure, logistics, hospitality, sponsorship of academic sessions, etc.
- vi. The responsibility of handling all the regulatory compliances related to the conference funds will be of the Organizing Committee, including but not limited to bank account, PAN, TAN, GST number etc. NAMS PAN, TAN etc. will not be available to organizing committee for this purpose.
- vii. The preparations for NAMSCON should be started much in advance (prior to submission of the Bid to host the NAMSCON) for smooth organization.

- viii. NAMS logo should be shown on every Podium Backdrop, print document, virtual platform, social media and certificates etc during the conference
- ix. The Organizing Committee will undertake to provide the following:
 - 1. Travel, logistics and local hospitality for (i) 3 (Key Note) speakers invited by NAMS from within India, (ii) the Chief Guest(s), (iii) up to three Guests of Honour and d) up to 5 officers or staff members of NAMS.
 - 2. Infrastructure and facilities for organizing the General Body Meeting of NAMS, the Council Meeting and other committee meetings of NAMS and sessions for presentations by the newly-elected Fellows/ Members/ Associate Fellows/ MNAMS, etc.
- x. The Organizing Committee will make every effort to seek participation of a large number of Fellows (including the newly-elected Fellows, Members and Associate Fellows) at the NAMSCON.
- xi. The Organizing Committee will submit an audited statement of accounts within 120 days after the end (Conclusion) of NAMSCON.

Responsibilities of National Academy of Medical Sciences (India)

- i. NAMS should have a core committee (including the State Convener) to have close coordination with the organizing committee of every NAMSCON.
- ii. The Core committee will review the Performa submitted by the applicant fellow for organizing the NAMSCON for the credibility and feasibility of the NAMSCON at proposed city and venue by the concerned fellow.
- iii. NAMS will coordinate with the Organizing Committee of the proposed NAMSCON duration and of the various sessions that should customarily be held at the conference.
- iv. If the Organizing Committee so requests, NAMS will extend an advance seed money (of up to Rs. 2.00 lakh for the annual NAMSCON and up to Rs. 1.50 lakh for the mid-term NAMSCON) to the Organizing Committee. This amount will be returned by the Organizing Committee to NAMS within 3 to 4 months after the NAMSCON.
- v. NAMS has some funds to support CMEs. It can thus consider providing financial support for the CMEs during the or Pre-conference, as per its guidelines for CMEs. The proposal for such CME(s) should be separately sent to NAMS at least 3 months in advance of the event and complying with all the requirements for holding CME.
- vi. NAMS will support travel, logistics and registration fee for its Council Members ONLY, who attend the NAMSCON and/or its Council meeting / Convocation.

Draft MoU/Document of Agreement between (Ann 2)

NAMS and

the Organizing Chairman hosting the annual/mid-term NAMSCON

The purpose of this MOU is to document the terms and conditions between the National Academy of Medical Sciences (India) (hereinafter called NAMS) and the Host Organizing Chairman NAMSCON (hereinafter called the Organizing Chairman) who has agreed to host the NAMS an annual/mid-term National Conference (hereinafter called the NAMSCON), the details of which appear in the title of this document.

The two parties jointly agree to act as follows:

- 1. The NAMS grants to the Organizing Chairman and the Organizing Chairman accepts all duties and responsibilities for planning, development, and implementation of the concerned NAMSCON. The Organizing Chairman agrees to use all efforts to organize a successful scientific, educational and cultural event.
- 2. The Organizing Chairman/Secretary will arrange to share the NAMS with facilities, equipment, and secretarial and clerical services for the conduct of its organizational affairs during the course of the NAMSCON. The NAMS agrees to, consistent with its capacity and to the extent requested by the Organizing Chairman/Secretary, provide assistance to the Organizing Chairman/Secretary in assuring the success of the NAMSCON. NAMS shall also provide finances as per the norms for holding pre-decided CMEs, Orations, Lectures and Symposia as per rules and regulations.
- 3. The delegate registration fees shall be such that these can support the organization of the event and shall be inclusive of all events and related taxes that the Organizing Chairman/Secretary may have to pay to various government departments, though this may not be detrimental for participation of the conference. Additional revenue may be generated from participants at a trade exhibition and from other sponsors under various other heads.
- 4. The Organizing Chairman shall constitute an Organizing Committee to help him in various aspects of organization of the NAMSCON, and inform its constituents (Constituents) to the NAMS. All communications between the Organizing Committee and NAMS will be routed through the Organizing Chairman.
- 5. The Organizing Chairman will periodically provide NAMS with updated information during the course of planning and development of the NAMSCON. The Organizing Chairman will maintain segregated accounts of all income and expenditure relating to the planning and development of the NAMSCON. The accounts of the NAMSCON will be held and accessed directly only by authorized representatives of the Organizing Chairman.
- 6. The NAMS may provide the Organizing Chairman, on the latter's request, an interest-free loan as "**Seed Money**" for initial planning and development of NAMSCON or Mid Term Conference, of up to Rs. 200,000 (Two hundred thousand Rupees) / Rs. 150,000 (one hundred and fifty thousand only) respectively. This loan amount shall be repayable as soon as possible but always within 90 (120) days after the end conclusion of NAMSCON or the end of the accounting year in which it was received, whichever is earlier. This repayment shall not be dependent on the financial outcome of the NAMSCON.
- 7. The Organizing Chairman shall inform the NAMS of its selection of a PCO Professional Conference Organiser if any and send a copy of the draft agreement between the Organizing Chairman and the PCO prior to its signing. NAMS shall have a right to suggest changes to such draft agreement.

- 8. The Organizing Chairperson undertakes to submit an audited final financial account of the NAMSCON, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, to NAMS no later than four (4) months after the last date of the NAMSCON.
- 9. The NAMS shall receive all 25% of the excess of revenue over all expenses, prior to any incentivized payments to the PCO, immediately following completion of the final audit. Any deficit resulting from an excess of expenditure over all revenue will be borne by the Organizing Committee. It is vital that the Organizing Chairman takes into consideration any taxes and currency transfer implications while preparing budget or spending on various activities for NAMSCON.
- The Organizing Chairman may obtain an insurance policy comprehensively covering any damage 10. and/or public liability for the NAMSCON – naming primarily the Organizing Chairman, NAMS Office Bearers or the Council and related members and staff of these organizations as the insured parties.
- 11. At its discretion, the Organizing Chairman may also obtain an insurance cover insuring the Organizing Committee against financial loss in the event of cancellation or impairment of the NAMSCON due to any unforeseen catastrophic event(s) or Force majeure.
- 12. Under No Circumstances, the NAMS Office and the President / Council Members, will be held responsible for any financial defaults/Liabilities towards unpaid expenses or any legal liabilities/or law suits arising out of any such disputes.
- 13. The Organizing Chairman will have the exclusive right to solicit contributions in support of the planning, development and conduct of the NAMSCON. Any such contributions shall be credited to the account opened for organization of the said NAMSCON.
- 14. The Organizing Chairman agrees to work in close cooperation with the NAMS Committee in the development and conduct of the programme for the NAMSCON.
- 15. The NAMS grants to the Organizing Chairman the rights to use the name and logo of the NAMS in connection with promotion, planning, development and implementation of the NAMSCON. The NAMS will indicate in all publicity that it is NAMS Annual Conference.
- The Organizing Chairman undertakes to provide complimentary NAMSCON registration to the 16. NAMS President, President-Elect and Immediate Past President (and their spouses), and Secretary of NAMS (Rest is already reimbursed by NAMS).
- 17. The Organizing Chairman also undertakes to provide complimentary accommodation for the NAMS President (and spouse) and NAMS Secretary from the time of arrival at the NAMSCON

Terms of Reference (TORs) for NAMS Standing Committee

Terms of Reference (TORs) for Standing Committees

1. Constitution of Standing Committees of NAMS:

As per the NAMS Memorandum of Association, Rules and Regulations, and Byelaws, there shall be the following Standing Committees:

- 1. Finance Committee
- 2. Academic Committee
- 3. Academic Excellence Recognition Committee
- 4. Estate Committee (Building Committee)
- 5. Publication Committee, and
- 6. Disciplinary Committee.

The Council may decide to set up additional Standing Committees with specific terms of reference for smooth functioning of the Academy.

Further, the Council may also set up one or more hoc committees for any specific work for a limited duration.

2. Membership of Standing (and Ad-hoc) Committees:

Each Standing Committee will be chaired by one of the Members of the Council. It can have up to seven members, who will be nominated by the Council from among the Fellows (who must form at least two-thirds of the members of the Standing Committee) or elected Members of the Academy.

The Council or Committee (with permission of the Council or the President) may invite any person other than Fellows or elected Members to attend one or more meetings of the Standing Committee as Special Invitee.

3. Terms of reference of Standing (and Ad-hoc) Committees:

The terms of reference and scope of work of each Standing committee are defined below.

However, the Council can review and revise these as necessary from time to time. For any Ad-hoc Committee being set up, the Council will lay down the duration of its operation and the terms of reference.

4. Functioning of Standing (and Ad-hoc) Committees:

The Standing (and Ad-hoc) Committees will function as follows:

- 4.1. The Chairperson should be a Council Member (as is the current practice).

 Both the Chairperson and; the Secretary should be nominated by the Council. The Standing Committee may invite subject matter experts as and when required.
- 4.2. Secretary of a Standing Committee shall keep record of its deliberations and submit a report to the Council through the Chairperson of the respective Committee;
- 4.3. The tenure of these Standing Committees should be three years and this may not be Co-coterminus with the tenure of the President. The frequency of meetings may be decided by the

- Council. However, there can be ONE Ex-officio Member in each committee to ensure continuity.
- 4.4. The standing committees work in an advisory capacity, and their reports will be presented to the Council, which will take any decisions regarding action on or implementation of their recommendations; and
- 4.5. A person cannot serve on more than two Standing Committees simultaneously.
- 4.6. Members of Standing Committees may receive traveling and halting allowances (TA and DA) for attending the Committee meetings, as per the rates prescribed under the Government of India's rules/Council, as applicable from time to time.

5. Terms of reference of the Finance Committee

The Committee shall provide guidance and recommendations to the Council on financial matters related to the Academy, including oversight on budget, analysis of financial status, compliance with financial regulations, and improving transparency and accountability in financial operations. The Finance Committee may invite expert(s) in the field of Finance as and when required.

Its key responsibilities shall include providing advice on:

- (a) Budget and accounting of funds of the Academy,
- (b) Oversee the accounts,
- (c) Oversee the vouchers of the receipts and expenditure of the Academy.
- (d) Annual Financial Statements of NAMS (Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account), before these are (i) signed by the authorised signatories viz. President, Secretary and the Accounts Officer and (ii) handed over to the Statutory Auditors (Chartered Accountant) for conducting audit, shall be reviewed by the Finance Committee and sent to the Council for approval.
- (e) The Annual Financial Statements (Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account) of the Academy shall be audited by a Chartered Accountant so appointed by the NAMS Council for the purpose. The Annual Financial Statements along with the Auditors; report thereon shall, after its review by the Finance Committee, will be placed before the NAMS Council for adoption and then, on adoption by the Council, shall be printed in the Annual Report of the Academy.
- (f) Financial Compliance: They ensure adherence to financial regulations and policies, promoting ethical and responsible financial practices.
- (g) They provide strategic financial advice to the Council, supporting informed decision-making on financial matters.
- (h) Risk Management: The committee helps identify and mitigate financial risks, protecting the organization from potential losses.
- (i) Internal Controls: Ensure the establishment and maintenance of effective internal controls to safeguard assets and prevent fraud.
- (j) review the Academy's capital structure and annual capital plan, including its capital

adequacy and capital planning process, stress-testing and related activities, capital raising, capital distributions, as well as approve and recommend to the full Council approval of our annual capital plan submission and capital management policy;

- (k) review financial aspects of the Corporation's recovery and resolution plans;
- (I) review the Corporation's asset/liability management; and
- (m) review any additional matters that the Council may direct to the Committee.

6. Terms of reference of the Academic Committee

The Academic Committee is tasked with supporting the Council in overseeing and advising on all academic matters, ensuring the quality and integrity of educational programmes organized or supported by the Academy in any manner. For this, it will:

- (a) Work and collaborate with academic institutions in India and establish partnerships with various stakeholders to develop networks of expertise across disciplines and domains to advance health, practice of medicine, and the development and use of related technology.
- (b) Provide evidence-based advisory services, by using expertise of accomplished and talented healthcare professionals from across the country and abroad. In this role, it is expected to act as a think-tank to provide intellectual leadership and direction to the medical and public health ecosystem, which may also provide expert evidence-based or consensus-driven solutions or approaches on various health-related issues.
- (c) To prioritize themes for developing and conducting CME programmes.
 - i. Review and approve funding support or accreditation of the CME programmes proposed by various institutions or organizations.
 - ii. Set policies for providing financial support and/or accreditation to CMEs, evaluate outcomes of such CMEs, and generally ensure compliance with accreditation standards.
 - iii. Identify educational needs of the medical professionals around the country and provide guidance to CME planners.
 - iv. Facilitate the conduct of professional CME programmes for healthcare professionals across India and abroad.
 - v. Establish a network of partner institutions to host and facilitate the initiatives of the NAMS in providing a reliable source of CME for healthcare professionals.

7. Terms of reference of the Academic Excellence Recognition Committee

The Academic Excellence Recognition Committee is tasked with supporting the Council in overseeing and advising on matters related to recognition of academic excellence by the Academy. For this, it will:

(a) Periodically review and suggest changes in guidelines, application procedure and assessment criteria for Academy's 'Recognition of Academic Excellence' (RAE), which is aimed at identifying and honouring eminent scientists in the field of medical, biomedical and dental sciences.

- (b) Evaluate applications for RAE as per the criteria laid down by the Council and recommend the names of suitable applicants for selection for various forms of recognition.
- (c) Evaluate applications for Emeritus Professorships awarded by the Academy as per the criteria laid down by the Council and recommend names of suitable applicants for this purpose.

8. Terms of reference of the Estate Committee

The Building Committee is tasked with supporting the Council in overseeing and advising on matters related to buildings and other infrastructure of the Academy. For this, it will:

- (a) Periodically review the physical infrastructure and facilities at NAMS House, in relation to requirements of the NAMS Office.
- (b) Ensure compliance with regulations, and maintaining the overall condition of buildings.
- (c) Prepare proposals for upgradation of physical infrastructure and facilities at NAMS House, as per requirements of the NAMS Office, and submit these to the Council.
- (d) Act as an advisory body for issues related to new constructions, renovations, and repairs, ensuring that the projects align with organizational goals
- (e) To generally oversee of all major capital works including construction, renovation and repairs (after securing the necessary administrative approval and financial sanction) to ensure that these are completed efficiently and safely
- (f) Advise the Council about procedures for enlistment of suitable contractors and the acceptance of tenders

9. Terms of reference of the Publication Committee

The Publication Committee is tasked with overseeing and guiding the Academy's publishing activities, including ensuring that its publications meet the necessary standards of quality, relevance, and ethical standards. For this, it will:

- (a) Periodically review the publication programme of the Academy, including books, journals, scientific communications, magazines, monographs, or any online or other hardcopy publications, and propose policies in this regard.
- (b) Assess the editorial quality and content of the publications of the Academy, and make recommendations to the Council.
- (c) Serve as a channel for communication between Fellows/Members/Associate Members of the Academy and other users of the Society's publications, the editorial teams for various publications of the Academy and the Council, to ensure that the needs of users are addressed within the parameters of quality, ethical standard and available resources.
- (d) Consult with and advise the editors of the above publications on issues related to editorial policy, content and quality of various publications.
- (e) Provide advice to the Council on matters of appointments concerning the various publications.

- (f) Make recommendations to the Council related to the needs and adequacy of the publications of the Society, including for initiation of new publications and curtailment of ongoing efforts, or changes in the focus and/or content of various publications.
- (g) Look at issues related to copyright on the various publications of the Academy.

10. Terms of reference of the Disciplinary Committee-

The Scope of Disciplinary Committee should be restricted to issues related to all NAMS Fellowships and; Memberships. For this, it will:

- (a) Propose the establishment of rules of conduct for Fellows, Members, Associate Members and staff of the Academy, educate the various stakeholders on these rules,
- (b) Examine any complaints against one or more Fellows, Members, Associate Members and staff members of the Academy that may be referred to it by the Council, prepare a report and propose appropriate action.


